Roy to kick off re-election campaign

Speaker of the House to be guest at Thursday event

FRANKLIN – As he officially gets his re-election campaign underway, state Rep. Jeffrey Roy, D-Franklin, will have one of Beacon Hill's top leaders supporting him.

Speaker of the House Robert A. DeLeo will help kick off Roy's campaign on Thursday, starting at 6:30 p.m. at the Franklin Elks Lodge #2136, 1077 Pond St.

Roy is seeking a fourth term in the 10th Norfolk District, which represents Franklin and Medway's precincts 2, 3 and 4.

DeLeo will give a speech at the event.

"I am honored to have him out in Franklin to help launch the campaign. I am not sure if he has done others, but given the fact that he put me on his leadership team last year and we have been

working closely on some bills together recently, I know that he wants to be helpful on my re-election efforts so we can continue to work together," Roy said.

Roy, who grew up in Milford and moved to Franklin with his wife in 1986 where they raised their family, currently serves as vice chairman of the Joint Committee on Health Care Financing and is a member of the Committees on Mental Health, Substance Use, and Recovery, Municipalities and Regional Government, and Export Development. He also serves as House chairman of the Manufacturing Caucus which promotes and encourages "Making It" in Massachusetts.

"I have enjoyed serving the residents of Franklin and Medway for the past

six years and would be honored to serve another term," he said. "We have made great progress in the areas of education, economic development, health care and veterans affairs, and I want to build on that success. In addition, we have addressed the challenges of substance use disorder, the environment, social equity, and criminal justice, and I look forward to continuing the work in these areas."

At a time when there is "gridlock and polarization" in Washington D.C., Roy noted he is proud to say, "our state legislature continues to work together to find solutions to the challenges we face as a state. It isn't a matter of Democrat or Republican, it's a matter of working on issues that will help the residents of our state and improve lives."

He is proud of his bipartisan approach to addressing the issues of interest to his district and the state at large.

"In that spirit, over the

past five and a half years, I have worked on legislation involving education, job creation and economic development, and protecting and helping those in need," he said.

On education, Roy filed legislation to bring civics education back to public school classrooms, to include acts of genocide across the globe in the history and social science curriculum frameworks, and to address student data privacy, computational thinking and computer coding in schools, and substance use screenings.

High on his agenda is addressing substance abuse.

"Locally, I was able to secure \$100,000 in state funding for the SAFE Coalition, a regional coalition that works to support those coping with substance abuse. We founded the Coalition in 2015 to provide a pathway for support, education, treatment options and coping mechanisms for

those affected by substance use disorder," he said. "The organization (<http://www.safecoalitionma.org/>) has provided resources to our community that were non-existent before 2015 and in the process has saved lives."

Roy said he is also proud of helping develop the criminal justice reforms that legislators introduced last month, as well as changes to the election laws "which foster a more vigorous, inclusive and just elections process."

"In each of these endeavors, I have maintained a commitment to working with all branches of government and maintaining civility in the process," he said. "I have brought experienced, bi-partisan leadership to the residents and businesses of the 10th Norfolk district and sought productive compromise rather than unavailing political points."
